

Jonah and the Fish

The story about Jonah and the “big fish” is a children’s Sunday School favorite; however, the lessons to be learned from Jonah have powerful and eternal implications for both children and adults.

God showed Jonah how much he cared for the 120,000 people living in Nineveh. They were people created and loved by Him. God had shown mercy on them, especially as they could not “... distinguish between their right and their left.” (4:11). This is proof of God’s love as He always takes the initiative in making us aware of our fallen condition.

In studying the story of Jonah it is learned that God’s will cannot be thwarted. It is both a responsibility and a privilege for believers to allow God to work through them. God’s will, will be accomplished, while it is also clear that our life decisions have consequences. Disobedience to God will have consequences not only for the disobedient, but the consequences of sin will impact others. But just as God demonstrated His love towards the Ninevites, He loves our children and invites them to have a relationship with Him.
